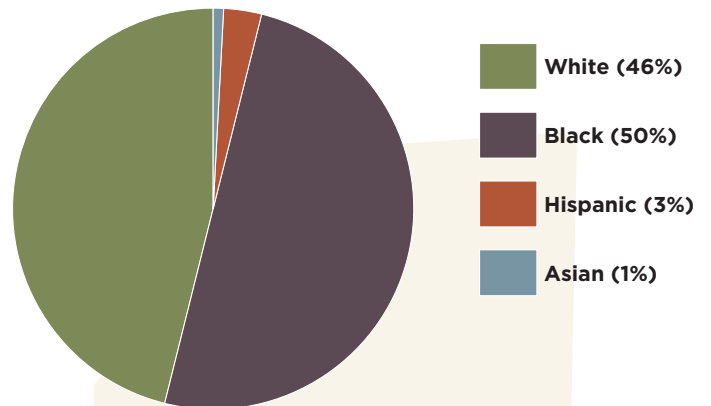

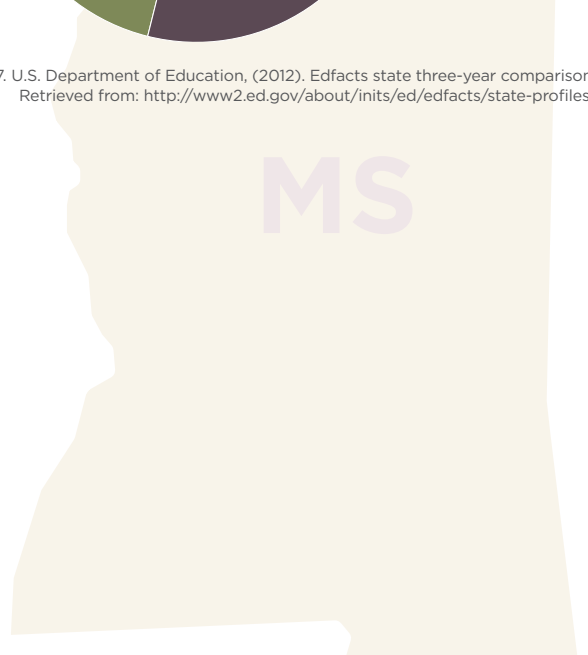

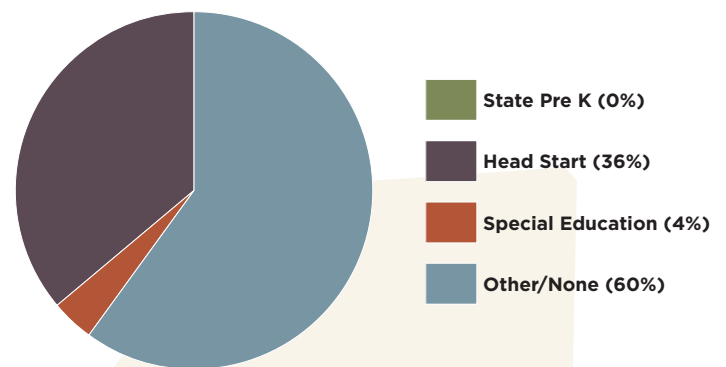

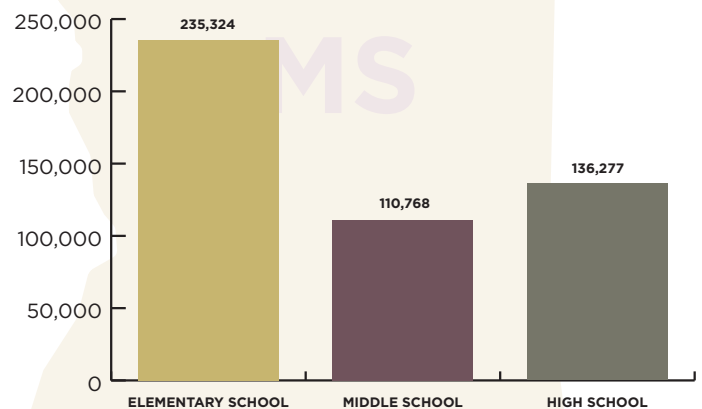

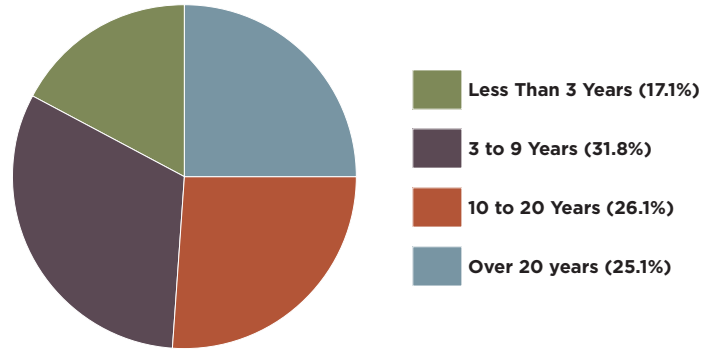

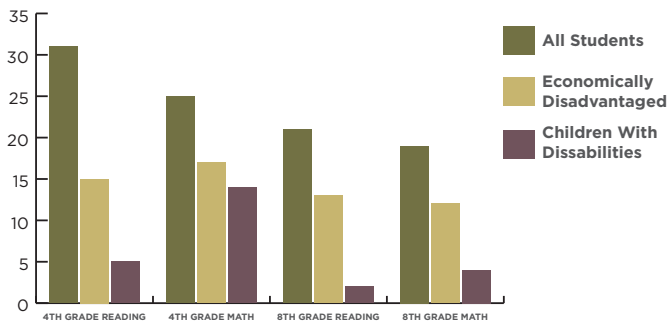

### Student Performance on the National Assessment of Educational Progress (2011)<sup>19</sup>

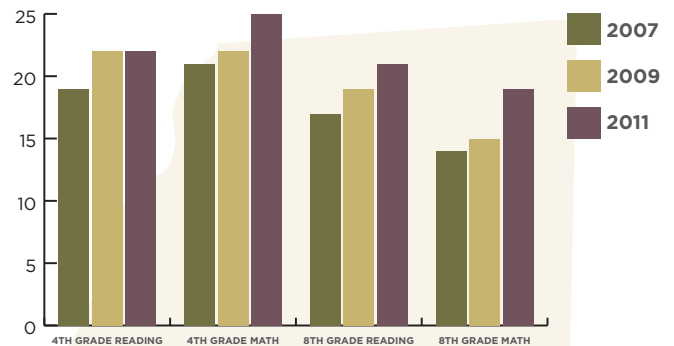

Percent of Students Scoring At or Above Proficient



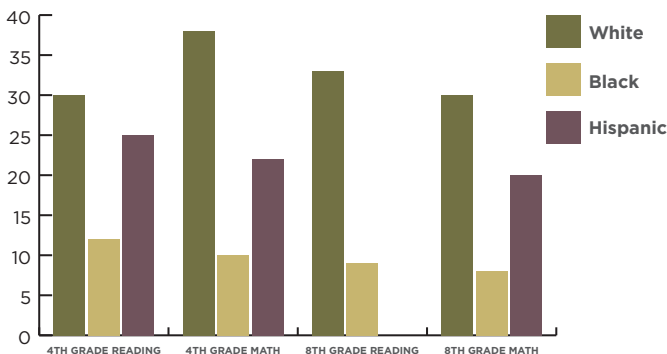

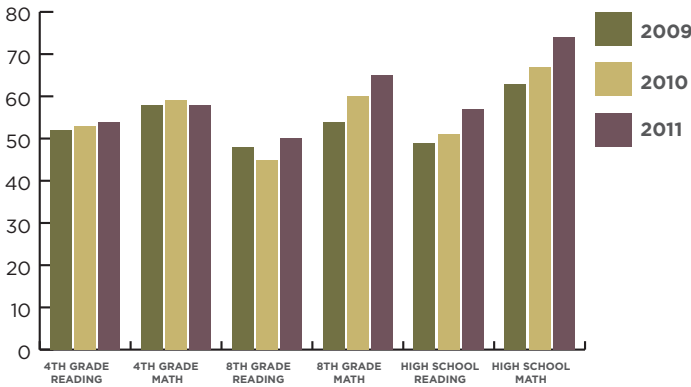

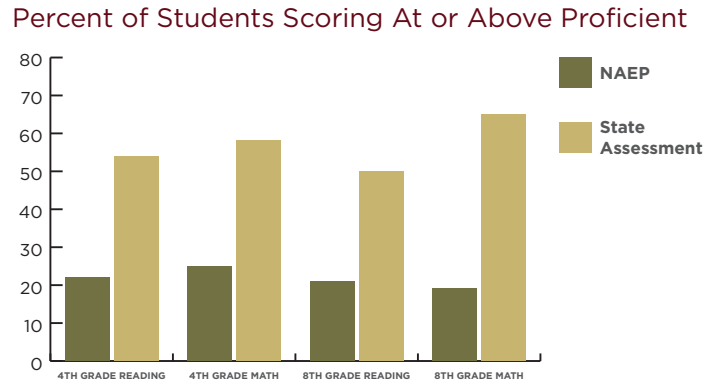

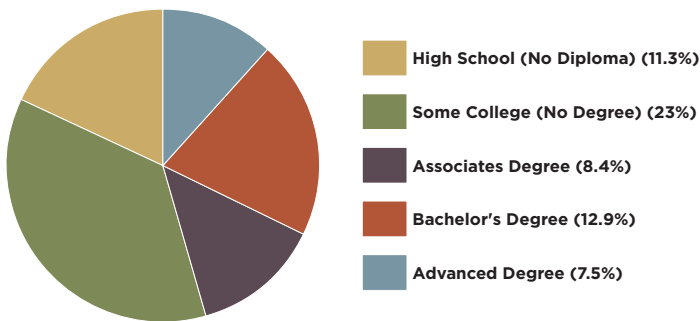
